STUDENT INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY POLICY

PURPOSE

While studying at Crestwood Preparatory College (the "School"), students may conceive, develop, create or author (together "**create**") intellectual property, either alone on jointly with other students, staff members, members of the School community or others. Examples of such works may include inventions, designs, software code, artwork, musical works, business plans, websites and technology ("**IP**"). Such IP may be protected by various intellectual property laws, and other laws.

This Policy does not apply to any IP created by students or staff members outside of their studies, coursework, School extracurriculars, duties or responsibilities with the School.

Staff

If staff members create IP during the course of their employment with, or while performing their duties and responsibilities with the School, this IP may be owned by the School. Please refer to the Staff Intellectual Property Policy for more details. This includes IP created jointly with students while supervising coursework, extracurriculars or special projects.

Students

All IP created by a student is the owned by that student. If the student creates the IP jointly with others (e.g. other students, staff members), these persons may also be owners of the IP with the student. If the IP is created with the supervision of teachers, School staff members or instructors, the School may also own or have an interest in the IP.

The purpose of this policy is to foster innovation and create a collaborative educational environment for students, while also encouraging respect for IP created by students and others. All School members must follow the guidelines below with respect to IP.

GUIDELINES

- The School may wish to promote or showcase any IP created by students. To do so, the School requires a license from <u>each</u> student who owns the IP to use the IP for certain purposes, like marketing, promotion or fundraising. A Student Intellectual Property License is attached, and should be distributed to all students and/or their parents to agree to and sign, before the beginning of each School year.
- Students may only license the IP they own. If the IP is owned jointly with other students or persons, then each student must sign the attached License separately. If the IP is co-owned by the student and the School, only the student(s) needs to sign the License to permit the School to use the IP.
- The School may require staff members to assign to the School their rights in IP created during course of their employment or duties and responsibilities with the School. Please refer to the Staff Intellectual Property Policy for more information.



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- It may be possible to protect the IP created according to intellectual property and other laws. However, the School will need to seek the advice of intellectual property lawyers to know whether it is possible to do so, or help students to do so. Therefore, any prototypes, working models, blueprints, or platforms of any IP should only be disclosed to those involved in the project or course, and even then with care.
- The School is not obligated seek protection for any IP created, or to pay for any costs to do so. Similarly, students are under no obligation to seek IP protection for any IP they create on their own. If the School and students jointly own IP they have created, this should be discussed further to ensure clarity about any decisions made about the IP in question.
- Students are encouraged to be cautious when sharing, posting, blogging or tweeting about IP they create, and to check with the School authorities before doing so.
- If students enter any contests, "hackathons" or competitions involving the IP, there may be additional rules that apply. Please consult with the School and read all contest rules before doing so.
- When creating IP, students and staff members must comply with the respective Acceptable Use
 of Technology Policies, Copyright Policy, Makerspace Policy and any other policies made or
 updated by the School.
